II. Chair's Report: James Carras

Vice Chair Hattan conducts the meeting, introduced and welcomed to the Housing Council two newly appointed members, Marcia Barry Smith, community representative, and Drew Saito, banker.

III. Director's Report: Jo Sesodia

Angela Chin provided the director's report on behalf of Jo Sesodia who could not attend because of a scheduling conflict. Ms. Chin introduces Tarnell Carroll, the new Public Communications Specialist for PDM Division. She will update the website and newsletters for the committee. Ms.

Carroll will provide a briefing on the website and making it more user friendly at the next committee meeting.

IV. Public Comments: No public comments.

V. Homeless Initiative Partnership (HIP) Administrator's Report: Michael Wright

Michael Wright informed Council members that the Continuum of Care Board will receive score for 2016 nomination. Top score in the nation was 197, 175, Broward received 167, in the top 10% of scores nationwide. Areas lost points creation of new permanent housing units and new rapid rehousing units. The Board of County Commissioners has appropriated new funding for 2017 to create more of these units with County funded dollars. Veterans Affairs renewed funding to Mission United and Operation Sacred Trust for veteran support services.

In 2017 HUD competition, the CoC is looking to reallocate money from projects that didn't draw down Homer funds to create additional projects for [unintelligible, 00:05:08) and rapid rehousing for families and youth. The new competition will probably be released in late May or early June, with an end date end of August or early September. Depending on Federal budgeting there may not be a lot of amount of new money for new projects so projects will be highly competitive and will continue this trend with probably a tier 1 allocation.

D. 2017 Affordable Housing Summit update

Sandra Veszi Einhorn reminds the council of resolution passed at the last meeting agreeing to partner with the Coordinating Council of Broward for a housing summit. The summit is expected to take place Wednesday, March 29, at Nova Southeastern University. The local priority is to identify and create a locally dedicated funding source for housing. Broward is considered bottom of the barrel when it comes to housing affordability in the country. The goal is to bring together entities to discuss Broward housing issues compared to the country, and put together a playbook of who and what funding sources are available. When the invites go out for the summit, the committee is looking for a large showing of elected and government officials, local leaders, and housing advocates.
