





Strategies

Street Outreach Strategies

- Engage families and individuals where they are – bridges, encampments, streets, meal sharing, etc.
- Engagement must be frequent and consistent.
- Complete assessments such as:
 - Client Profile
 - Housing Barrier Assessment
 - V-SPDAT

New Strategies for Street Outreach

- Administrative Officer for HIP manages all families matters from shelter to housing
- Plan to launch a Family Outreach Team
- Plan to launch a Domestic Violence Outreach Team
- Create strategies to launch a Medical Outreach Team focusing on the most vulnerable and mentally compromised.

Housing Strategies

- Coordinated Entry and Assessment provides a single access point for permanent housing.
- Provides the ability to prioritize those in most need.
- Continue to utilize the Housing First Approach.

New Strategies for Permanent Housing

- Explore alternative housing types such as ALF's, Halfway Houses, Transitional Housing.
- Increased the number of Permanent Supportive funding for those who may not necessarily be "Chronic".
- Explore using Rapid Rehousing as a bridge to Permanent and Supportive housing by increase monthly subsidies up to 24 months.
- October 1, 2020 HIP launched the Landlord Recruitment Campaign

Your rental property provides a fresh start, along a new-found security which results in successful tenants.

Becoming a RentalNet landlord is simple

RentalNet makes it easy to sign on as a participating landford. Simply register on our website and post your available properties today; I case managers from our highly reputable housing providers will browse the listings to identify units that will be a good match for the homeless clients they are serving. Listings will not be publicly viewable and can only be searched by authorized case managers. When a case manager identifies a potential tenant that would be a good match for your property, you will be contacted to confirm availability and schedule an inspection. You will have an opportunity to screen the potential tenant, conducting background screenings and credit checks if desired. Once you agree to rent to the tenant, and upon satisfactory inspection, both you and the tenant will sign an official lease. Not only will you have filled your vacant unit and played a key tole in ending homelessness for your new tenant, you will have become a RentalNet landford with all the RentalNet benefits!
