About the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) Program



Part of the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 (IRA) to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) pollution.



Dual-phased program.



EPA funding to achieve three objectives:

Tackling **climate pollution** while supporting the **creation of good jobs** and **lowering energy costs** for families.

Accelerating work to **address environmental injustice** and **empowering** community-driven **solutions** in **overburdened neighborhoods**.

Delivering **clean air** by reducing air pollution.

Two Phases – Two Grants

Phase 1 (non-competitive) – Planning Grants

Funding: \$1M for most populous metropolitan areas

Goal: Develop plans to reduce GHGs

Deliverables

- Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP)
- Regional Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions Inventory
- Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP)

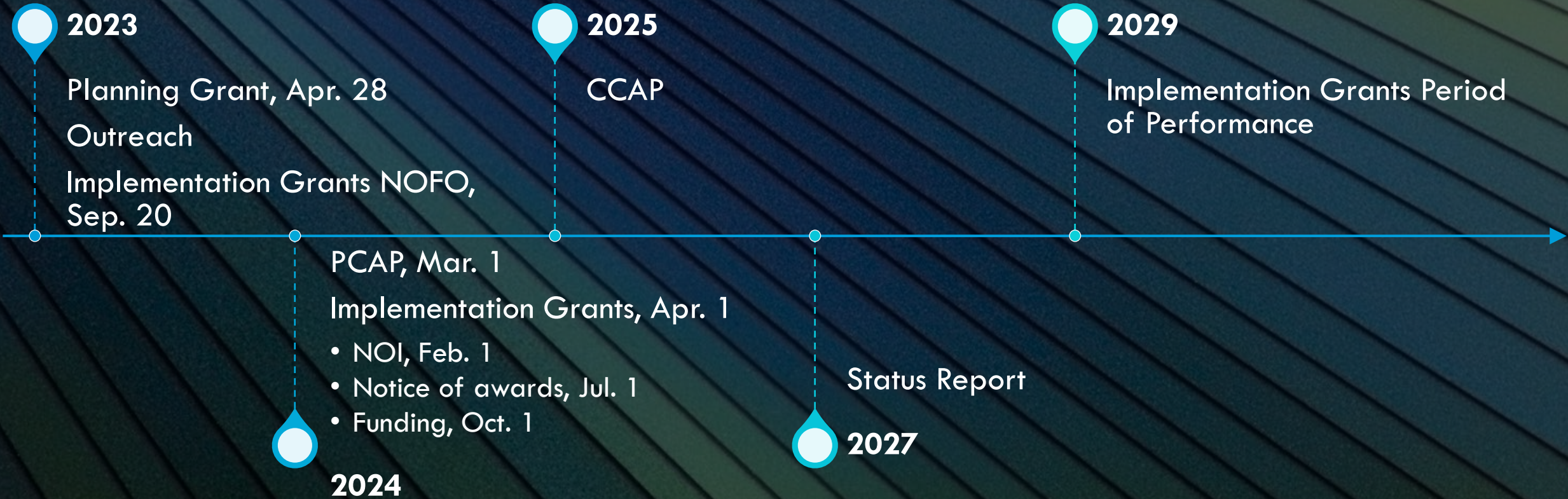
Phase 2 (competitive) – Implementation Grants

Funding: Total \$4.6B for 30 -115 awards (\$2M - \$500M)

Goal: Implement measures from GHG reduction plans developed with planning grant funding.

Separate NOFO and competitive funding for tribes and territories

Timeline



Phase 1 Updates

- MSA Award \$1M 😊
 - Monroe, Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties
- Regional coordination
- Identified contractor and subrecipients – PCAP Components
- PCAP components underway

Phase 2 – Implementation Grants

- Reduce cumulative GHG emissions by 2030 and beyond, and enhance decarbonization major GHG emitting in sectors
- Municipalities covered in MSA PCAP are eligible applicants
- Incentivizes eligible applicants to apply for funding together as a coalition
- Coordination is key!

Table 1: Grants Ranges and Funding by Tier

Tier	Grant Ranges	Funds Targeted for Each Tier	Anticipated Number of Grants to be Awarded
Tier A	\$200,000,000 – \$500,000,000	\$2 billion	4-10
Tier B	\$100,000,000 – \$199,999,999	\$1.3 billion	6-13
Tier C	\$50,000,000 – \$99,999,999	\$0.6 billion	6-12
Tier D	\$10,000,000 – \$49,999,999	\$0.3 billion	6-30
Tier E	\$2,000,000 – \$9,999,999	\$0.1 billion	10-50
