INTERESTED IN EARNING MORE CONTACT HOURS?

- 28 hours of training are required during the 2-year building certification cycle.
- 60 hours of training are required during the 4-year fire certification cycle.
- By attending Broward BORA's board meetings and/or committee meetings, 1 hour of the required credit will be earned.
- By attending professional association meetings approved by the BORA Staff (i.e. FAPGMI, IAEI, COEA), ½ hour of the required credit will be earned for each meeting attended.

A maximum of 14 total contact hours through board and/or committee meetings can be earned per certification cycle.

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FLORIDA FIRE PREVENTION CODE AMENDMENTS

At a public hearing in **August**, the Board approved **Amendments** to the following:

Florida Fire Prevention Code, Section F-103.3.7

After receiving recommendations from the <u>Fire Code Committee</u>, the Board approved revisions to the Florida Fire Prevention Code, Section F-103.3.7, Assistant Fire Marshal.

The Fire Chief Association of Broward County believes the revisions would allow individuals who might be qualified to be Fire Marshals within a fire prevention bureau to have experience in assisting in managing the bureau while the Fire Marshal is away or needs assistance in everyday activities.

The new code section sets up the requirements for becoming an assistant fire marshal if appointed by the Fire Chief. This code section aligns fire with what is currently being done in the building departments, where Assistant Building Officials are in place.

BORA COMMERCIAL ENERGY GUIDELINES (PERFORMANCE OPTION)

After receiving recommendations from the <u>Energy Conservation Committee</u>, the Board <u>approved</u> the <u>BORA Commercial Energy Guidelines (Performance Option)</u> of the 7th Edition (2020) Florida Building Code, Energy <u>Conservation</u>.

These guidelines serve as a tool for Building Officials to adopt as part of their plan review and inspection processes as an aid to assign duties and assure compliance.

The Florida Building Code Energy Conservation administrative chapters do not designate which discipline-specific code official will review energy compliance reports and building plans and inspect specific items in the Energy Conservation Code.



2023 BUILDING SAFETY INSPECTION PROGRAM FOLLOW-UP

During the summer months, municipal building departments throughout Broward County began sending notifications to property owners whose buildings are subject to the <u>Building Safety Inspection</u> <u>Program</u>, initiating the process of having the property inspection completed by a Florida-licensed professional. Please be advised that the Building Safety Inspection Program does not require the building to be brought up to the current code.

- 7th Edition Florida Building Code (2020), Chapter 1 Section 110.15
- Building Safety Inspection Program
 - BORA Policy 05-05
 - Electrical Policy #05-05
 - Structural Policy #05-05

If you do not receive a notification and your property is 25 years or older, don't hesitate to get in touch with the building department in the municipality where your property is located. You will still be held accountable for completing the inspection whether the municipality contacts you or not.

For Structural questions, contact <u>Jack Morell</u> or <u>Michael Guerasio</u>. For Electrical questions, contact <u>Kenneth Castronovo</u>. For previous inspection records, please contact the <u>municipality</u> where your property is located.

The following buildings or structures are exempt from this program:

- U.S. Government buildings
- State of Florida buildings
- Buildings built on Native American tribal lands
- School buildings under the jurisdiction of the Broward County School Board
- One- and two-family dwellings
- Fee Simple Townhouses as defined in the FBC
- *Minor Structures* are defined as buildings/ structures in any occupancy group having a gross floor area of less than 3,500 sq. ft.

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BORA RECERTIFICATION CYCLE (2024-2025)

The application process for the 2024-2025 Building Recertification Cycle is underway. Be sure to submit your recertification packet by Tuesday, December 5, 2023, to the Broward County Board of Rules and Appeals office (1 N. University Drive, Suite 3500B, Plantation, FL 33324).

The <u>Recertification Forms</u> can be found on the Broward BORA website. All Building Officials, Assistant Building Officials, Chief Inspectors, Plans Examiners, and Inspectors who are presently certified by BORA must complete this process.

Please remember the following important notes for the recertification process:

- Complete and return all forms to the BORA office by December 5, 2023.
- Attach the Continuing Education Affidavit signed by the applicant.
- 28 educational contact hours must have been completed by December.
 - Note: At least ½ of this requirement must be discipline-specific courses.
- Please include the notarized Affidavit, the Board of Rules and Appeals Policy #14-02.
- Your new 2024-2025 recertification cards will be valid through December 31, 2025.

- The six-month loan period starts when the books are picked up from the Broward BORA office.
 - **Note:** Individuals can return borrowed books by the end of the six-month loan period or utilize the one-time 3-month extension.

Remember, the books are loaned to other code officials after they are returned. Please show consideration by not writing or highlighting in the books and returning materials on time.

Broward County Code of Ordinances, ARTICLE IX. - BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION, Section 9.02

"Building Code and the Board of Rules and Appeals" mandates that BORA members shall be appointed as follows:

- Seven (7) members and six (6) alternates shall be appointed by the Broward County League of Cities.
- Six (6) members and three (3) alternates shall be appointed by the County Commission.
