RE: Response to Extend the Implementation of Fire Station Alerting System to June 2019

Dear Mr. Harrison,

I am in receipt of your letter dated March 20, 2018, requesting an extension to June 2019 for the City's transition to the new Fire Station Alerting System (FSAS).

The FSAS implementation schedule calls for the final design to be completed this summer with testing and cut-over anticipated to be completed by the first quarter of calendar year 2019. Following the cutover, we are scheduled to run dual systems for a short period of time. It appears we have some flexibility to schedule you last provided no other issues with municipalities occur, which may or may not get you to June 2019. We will do our best, but I encourage you to expedite finding the funds as soon as possible as the existing FSAS is more than 20 years old and is at end of life with no maintenance support.
