12	WHEREAS, the Board has determined that amending the membership	
13	composition and updating the functions of the Broward County Homeless Continuum of	
14	Care Board in line with state and federal laws and regulations is appropriate at this time,	
15	NOW, THEREFORE,

17	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF

20	Section 1. Section 12.152 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby	
21	amended to read as follows:	
22	12.152. Creation.	
23	There is hereby created and established a Broward County Homeless Continuum

1	of Care Board ("Homeless Continuum of Care Board") <u>("HCoC")</u> . The Homeless
2	Continuum of Care Board HCoC shall will serve in an advisory capacity to the Broward
3	County Board of County Commissioners ("Board"), making recommendations to the
4	Board for the establishment and implementation of the Homeless Continuum of Care,
5	programs and services for the community-based homeless assistance program planning
6	network of providers comprised of various organizations within Broward County, to
7	efficiently and effectively deliver coordinated housing and related services to the
8	homeless in Broward County. The Homeless Continuum of Care Board <u>HCoC</u> shall <u>will</u>
9	also act advocate on behalf of the Homeless Continuum of Care, as defined by the
10	McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 11381 et seq. ("Act"),
11	24 C.F.R. Part 578, and Chapter 420, Florida Statutes, to provide collaborative local
12	homeless assistance efforts through Homeless Continuum of Care programs the network
13	of providers in Broward County authorized by the federal HEARTH Act, 42 U.S.C. 11371
14	et seq., and 24 CFR Part 576.
15	
16	Section 2. Section 12.153 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby
17	amended to read as follows:
18	12.153. Composition; Nominations and Appointments.
19	(a) The Homeless Continuum of Care Board ("HCOC") HCoC shall will be
20	composed of twenty-eight (28) thirty (30) voting members and two (2)
21	nonvoting ex-officio <u>ex officio</u> members <u>, for a total of thirty-two (32)</u>
22	members. The Board of County Commissioners ("Board") shall will appoint
23

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1	mem	bers to the HCOC HCoC from persons nominated as follows, with
2	nomii	nations by the Board made in accordance with applicable advisory
3	board	d categorical draw processes:

7		who will be a major who oversees homeless street outreach;

9		c. One (1) member nominated by The Chief of Police of the City
10		of Hollywood Police Department, or his or her designee who
11		will be a major who oversees homeless street outreach;
12	6.	One (1) Broward County Commissioner nominated by the Mayor;
13	7.	One (1) representative of a domestic violence services organization
14		nominated by a Broward County Commissioner and appointed by the
15		Board;
16	8.	Three (3) elected municipal officials or designees employees from
17		municipalities that are designated as a U.S. Department of Housing
18		and Urban Development ("HUD") Community Development Block
19		Grant ("CDBG") Entitlement entitlement Community community,
20		each nominated by the corresponding municipality as follows:
21		a. One (1) from the City of Fort Lauderdale;
22		b. One (1) from the City of Hollywood; and
23		c. One (1) from the City of Pompano Beach;
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1	9.	The Chairperson of the Homeless Provider and Stakeholders'
2		Stakeholder's Council;
3	10.	Three (3) advocate representatives for the homeless nominated by
4		a Broward County Commissioner and appointed by the Board,
5		one (1) in for each of the following areas populations of focus: youth;
6		family families; and veterans affairs;
7	11.	Two (2) persons who are currently homeless or who have formerly
8		experienced homelessness, nominated by a Broward County
9		Commissioner and appointed by the Board;
10	12.	One (1) Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce
11		representative nominated by its Board of Directors;
12	13.	One (1) representative nominated by The Chief Executive Officer, or
13		his or her designee, of CareerSource Broward or successor entity;
14	14.	One (1) representative nominated by the Board of Directors of
15		Broward Behavioral Health Coalition. Inc.;
16	15.	One (1) faith-based organization representative appointed by the
17		Board;
18	16.	One (1) representative of a recipient or subrecipient of a HUD
19		Emergency Solutions Grant Recipient (authorized by the Act,
20		42 U.S.C. 11371 et seq., and 24 C.F.R. Part 576), nominated by a
21		Broward County Commissioner and appointed by the Board. This
22		appointment shall will not be subject to either Section 1-233(b)(1) or
23		Section 1-233(b)(3), Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code");

15		program funds, or other federal funds when developing affordable
16		housing, nominated by a Broward County Commissioner and
17		appointed by the Board;
18	21.	20. One representative nominated by the Greater Fort Lauderdale
19		Alliance Foundation, Inc.; and
20	22.	21. One (1) representative nominated by the Broward Workshop,
21		Inc. <u>:</u>

10	ager	ncy receiving funding, and shall <u>must</u> submit a letter of resignation if a
11	confl	lict develops after appointment.
12	(c) Indiv	iduals from the community who are not appointed to the HCOC HCoC
13	may	serve on task forces and subcommittees as established by the \ensuremath{HCOC}
14	<u>HCo</u>	<u>C</u> . Appointments to fill task forces and subcommittees shall <u>will</u> be at
15	the c	liscretion of the HCOC Chair of the HCoC.
16	<u>(d)</u> <u>Repr</u>	resentatives nominated by entities holding a seat on the HCoC to be
17	appo	pinted by the Board will not be subject to the Broward County residency
18	<u>requ</u>	irements set forth in Section 1-233(b)(1) of the Code. Broward County
19	resid	lency will be required for all persons nominated by a Broward County
20	Com	missioner to be appointed by the Board.

22	Section 3.	Section 12.154 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby
23	amended to read a	as follows:
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1	12.15	4. Term of Appointees.
2	(a)	A member of the HCOC HCoC whose seat rotates on a recurring basis
3		("rotating category") shall may serve in such rotating category for two (2)
4		years or until his or her successor is appointed, whichever is sooner. All
5		other members of the HCOC HCoC shall will serve in accordance with
6		Section 1-233, Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code") of the Code,
7		and are specifically exempt from the requirements set forth in
8		Section 1-233(b)(2) of the Code.
9	(b)	Upon the expiration of a term, a member of the HCOC HCoC not in a
10		rotating category shall may continue to serve until a successor is appointed,
11		under the provisions set forth in Section 1-233 of the Code.
12	(c)	Any appointed member may be removed by the Board for misconduct,
13		incompetency, or neglect of duty on its own motion or upon
14		recommendation of the HCOC HCoC.
15	(d)	The meetings, quorum, organization, and attendance requirements of the
16		HCOC HCoC shall will be as set forth in Section 1-233 of the Code.
17	(e)	The HCOC HCoC shall will elect a chair and such other officers as are
18		deemed necessary for purposes of managing its activities and bringing
19		direction and leadership to the HCOC <u>HCoC</u> . Each officer shall <u>will</u> serve
20		for one (1) year and may serve for two (2) subsequent terms until his or her
21		successor is chosen.
22	(f)	The HCOC HCoC shall will adopt rules of procedure for the transaction of
23		business by majority vote of the entire membership, keep a written record
24		of meetings, resolutions, findings, and determinations, and establish a

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1		governance charter, in accordance with the requirements of the Act and
2		<u>24 C.F.R. Part 578</u> .
3	(g)	Members of the HCOC HCoC are public officers and are therefore subject
4		to the applicable standards of conduct and voting conflicts requirements of
5		the Florida Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, Chapter 112,
6		Part III, Florida Statutes. Members will also comply with conflict-of-interest
7		requirements under the Act and 24 C.F.R. Part 578.

9			participation in the Homeless Continuum of Care; raising funds from the
10			private sector and other funding streams; and encouraging additional
11			financial support from entitlement communities.
12	6.	<u>(f)</u>	Recommend any additional actions deemed necessary by the Homeless
13			Continuum of Care Board HCoC to advance the Action Consolidated Plan
14			and otherwise assist the homeless in Broward County.

9		5. Facilitate the delivery of multi-agency services for the homeless to
10		eliminate duplication of services and to maximize the use of limited
11		existing resources for the homeless.
12	6. <u>(g)</u>	Identify potential new programs and gaps in services to fill critical service
13		gaps, if necessary, through and review recommendations for reallocation of
14		existing resources for the homeless.
15	7. <u>(h)</u>	Develop a Review the community resource directory developed by the
16		County of regarding services available to the homeless for use by agencies,
17		volunteers, information and referral systems, and homeless persons.
18	8. <u>(i)</u>	Develop public education and outreach initiatives to make homeless
19		persons aware of the services available to them through community
20		agencies and organizations.
21	9. <u>(j)</u>	Identify and explore new approaches to shelter care and other permanent
22		housing interventions for the homeless.

If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to
be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity
of the remainder of this Administrative Code Resolution. If any court determines that this
Administrative Code Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any
individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the
applicability of this Administrative Code Resolution to any other individual, group, entity,
property, or circumstance.
