1. CALL TO ORDER / PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE / ROLL CALL

2. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

On Motion of Ms. Feiler, seconded by Ms. Decoste, and unanimously carried, the Human Rights Board adopted

the Agenda, as submitted.

3. APPROVAL OF BOARD MEETING MINUTES

On Ms. Feiler's Motion to approve minutes, as amended, to reflect Mr. Berger's nomination for Chair, seconded by Ms. Decoste, passed unanimously.

4. CHAIR/VICE CHAIR REPORT

Mr. Rajner advised that he and Ms. Fishman met over the holidays in an effort to plan for the upcoming Board meeting and will be doing so going forward. This is to ensure we keep meetings timely.

5. LITIGATION REPORT

Mr. Katzman provided an update on two cases in litigation with the County Attorney's Office. In both cases, Respondents, Cintron vs. Environ Towers I Condominium Association and Gokool vs. Hunters Nightclub, the Respondent has provided a response. As it relates to Gokool v. Hunter's Nightclub, the Hearing Panel is being selected.

There was also a follow-up on the clarification of how members are chosen for the hearing panels. Ms. Feiler made a motion to establish a committee to develop an orientation/training to hearing panels or a hearing panel guide, seconded by Dr. Davis-Jerome, passed unanimously.

6. UNFINISHED BUSINESS: CEDAW UPDATE

Mr. Rajner requested whether the Human Rights Section staff provided an update on a timeline related to CEDAW.

Mr. Rajner wanted to ensure that all Board members have a full understanding of CEDAW and would schedule a training for the Board. Dr. Davis Jerome provided a brief overview of what CEDAW is and the purpose.

On a motion of Ms. Feiler to reschedule the March 2019 meeting to April 8, 2019, seconded by Ms. Fishman, passed unanimously.

Mr. Rajner asked the Board, if they would like to form a By-Laws committee to review and correct the Meeting Section of the Human Rights Board By-Laws. Mr. Katzman advised he could provide a draft, and have it sent out. Mr. Rajner requested the draft be prepared and ready for the Chair/Vice-Chair meeting to be held in February.

Mr. Rajner provided that the website that contains information on the Human Rights Board is outdated. Mr. Rajner requested volunteers to participate in an Outreach Committee to review the website, etc.

Ms. Fishman provided an update coordinate training on Racial Equity vs. Racial Equality.

Mr. Barkey requested the Board discuss whether it could create a coalition on Hate Crimes. Mr. Rajner advised that it be added to February's agenda.

Ms. Estevez stated on January 10, 2019, the City of Fort Lauderdale will begin holding Community Court to address minor offenses.

Ms. Fishman also provided funeral services for Edith Lederburg on January 9, 2019, at Star of David in North Lauderdale.

Dr. Davis-Jerome also provided the Global Engagement Summit will take place in New York City, President's Day weekend. Registration is \$20 and is now open.

Human Rights Staff also reminded to the Human Rights Board of the 2020 Census Kick-Off will take place on January 9, 2019.
